### Health related quality of life following treatment of insulinoma in dogs

#### INFORMATION SHEET

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### Background to the research

Insulinoma is the most common tumour of the endocrine pancreas in dogs. Insulinomas can be medically and/or surgically treated depending on the extent of the disease. Although previous research has demonstrated that the type of treatment pursued is predictive of the prognosis of a dog with insulinoma, no research has been performed to assess the quality of life of dogs with insulinoma during and after treatment.

### The surveys (RVC Social Science Ethical Review Board reference: URN SR2023-0035)

If you agree to participate you will be asked to fill out an online questionnaire regarding your dog's quality of life before and a month after (initiation of) treatment. If you agree, subsequently we will also email you the questionnaire at 4-6 month intervals for comparison and monitoring of your dog's progress. You can opt to have a copy of the form you fill out automatically emailed to you for your own records. At any stage you can opt out of receiving any further quality of life questionnaires. Using our Health Related Quality of Life Questionnaire will allow:

- 1. You, the client, to be able to monitor your dog's quality of life accurately before, during and after (initiation of) treatment.
- 2. Us, the RVC, to gather long-term outcome data on this population of dogs to help us inform our owners of dogs with this condition even more accurately about their long-term outcome in the future and ultimately also publish our information for the benefit of other vets and owners.
